On **October 21**, FREA will partner with the FL SUN (Florida Solar United Neighbor) co-op program to hold open house tours of more than 20 solar-powered homes throughout Florida. On **October 28**, FREA will sponsor 15 open house sites of solar-powered homes and business in greater Central Florida.
